



Dave Barry




Dave Barry, Pulitzer Prize-Winning Columnist and Humorist was born in Armonk New York, in 1947, and has been steadily growing older ever since without ever actually reaching maturity!

Barry was an English major at Haverford College, graduated in 1969 and eventually got a job with a newspaper named the "Daily Local News," in West Chester, Pa. In 1980 he took a job at The Miami Herald and has been there ever since, although he never answers the phone. In 1988 he won the Pulitzer Prize for commentary. His column appears in more than 500 newspapers in the United States and abroad.

Dave has also written a total of 25 books; virtually none of them contain useful information!

Memorials, Monuments and Museums

Arlington Cemetery



Commemorate the men and women who gave their vision and their lives for the glory of America. Cross over the mighty Potomac River to sprawling Arlington National Cemetery. Ride through the myriad gravesites, some 270,000 identical headstones mark this vast expanse, all symmetrically arrayed about the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Continue on to the inspiring gravesite of President John F. Kennedy, crowned with its ever-flickering Eternal Flame. Perched high atop Arlington Cemetery's highest hill, is Arlington House, the home of Civil War General Robert E. Lee. Before returning to Washington, visit another monument to American military valor, the Marine Corps War Memorial, more commonly referred to as "Iwo Jima Memorial" the famous statue of U.S. soldiers defending their flag during World War II.

A Genealogical Experience - DAR Museum

A stroll through the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) Museum is a stroll through the many colorful regions and time periods of America itself. The museum building serves as the headquarters of DAR, an association of women who trace their lineage back to the Revolutionary War. Inside this immense and elaborate four-story Beaux-Arts affair, each room has been sponsored by one of DAR's state chapters and has been decorated to reflect a certain time period of that state's history. Like the Tennessee Room, resplendent with White House furnishings from the Monroe presidency; the Oklahoma Room, a rustic prairie farm kitchen; or, the Missouri Room, a decadent steamboat parlor, to name a few. Next, enter the DAR Library for a special genealogical experience. Terry Ward, Director of Genealogy at DAR, will speak to you about the process of tracing your own family tree. After the lecture, you will be given free time in the Library to begin the process of researching your own family history.

George Washington's Home (Mt. Vernon)

Begin your day with a visit to George Washington's home, **Mt. Vernon**, a stately Georgian manor house. Once inside, take care not to miss the many personal effects of the Washington family that are on display throughout the rooms, which themselves are wonders of historical accuracy. Following your tour of the manor, explore the grounds and visit President Washington's private wharf. Hear about Washington the family man; Martha's role as mistress of the estate; Washington's views on slavery; and his strength of character – even when faced with his own death. After departing Mt. Vernon, visit George Washington's hometown, **Alexandria** for a scrumptious **lunch** at George Washington's favorite watering hole: **Gadsby's Tavern**. Located in a lovely, Federal-period brick inn, Gadsby's has been entertaining American heroes since 1770. Following lunch, stroll old **King Street**, browsing in its many quaint boutiques before returning to DC.

The Lincoln Experience

Over a century after his death, President Abraham Lincoln is still remembered the world-over for his courage to govern "with malice toward none," his commitment to liberty, and of course, his honesty. Relive one of the greatest tragedies in American history at **Ford's Theatre**, site of Lincoln's assassination, which is preserved to appear as it did in Lincoln's day. Cross the street to visit the **Petersen House**, where Lincoln was taken for medical attention but died the next morning. Reboard your coach for a riding tour focusing on the conspiracy to kill Lincoln. See Mary Surratt's Boarding House, where John Wilkes Booth held residence. For months before the assassination, Ms. Surratt, a Confederate sympathizer, frequently welcomed the Lincoln conspirators into her inn to plot their deed. Before returning to the Convention Center, pay tribute to President Lincoln at the **Lincoln Memorial**. Gaze in awe at the solemn statue that keeps watch over our capital.

Hillwood Museum

Visit one of the grandest residences in all of Washington. The **Hillwood Museum** is the former estate of **Marjorie Merriweather Post**, cereal heiress and grand dame of Washington Society. Built in 1926, this opulent 40-room Georgian mansion houses a plethora of extraordinary art works and furnishings. View Hillwood's collection of Russian treasures, which many believe to be the most representative outside of Russia itself. See elaborate icons, priceless gold and silver pieces, and an extensive array of dazzling Faberge eggs.
