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| 2020 Interoperability and Information Blocking Regulations | HHS | All Health Care Actors | April 21, 2020 | HHS finalizes two rules: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CMS Final Rule • ONC Final Rule |
| Public reporting of providers engaged in information blocking | CMS | Providers (All) | Late 2020 | CMS will publicly report eligible clinicians, hospitals, and critical access hospitals (CAHs) that may be information blocking based on how they attested to certain Promoting Interoperability (PI) program requirements. |
| Public reporting of providers who do not update digital contact information | CMS | Providers (All) | Late 2020 | CMS will publicly report providers who do not list or update their digital contact information in the National Plan and Provider Enumeration System (NPPES); to include information such as secure digital endpoints like a Direct Address and/or a FHIR API endpoint. |
| Admission, discharge, and transfer event notifications | CMS | Providers (Hospitals) | 12 Months Following Final Rule Date (April 2021) | CMS requires hospitals (including psychiatric hospitals and CAHs) to send electronic patient event notifications of a patient's admission, discharge, and/or transfer to another healthcare facility or to another community provider or practitioner. |
| Information blocking requirements | ONC | Providers (All) | 6 Months Following Final Rule Date (October 2020) | Providers must come into compliance with information blocking requirements. ONC has listed exceptions to these requirements here. |
| Information blocking requirements (con't) | ONC | Providers (All) | 18 Months Following Compliance Deadline (April 2022) | Providers will face enforcement penalties if they are not in compliance with information blocking requirements. <u>Note:</u> April 24, 2020 the OIG issued a proposed rule stating that they will refer enforcement penalties of negligent |
