- 8. insertion, placement, and removal of surgical drain(s), re-infusion device(s), irrigation tube(s), or catheter(s)
- 9. closure of wound and repair of tissues divided for initial surgical exposure, partial or complete
- application of initial dressing, orthosis, continuous passive motion, splint, or cast, including traction, except where specifically excluded from global package
- preparation and insertion of synthetic bone substitutes, osteoconductive
  and osteoinductive agents (eg, hydroxyapatite, calcium phosphates, coral,
  methylmethacrylate, demineralized bone matrix, bone morphogenetic proteins),
  except where specifically excluded
- 12. diagnostic arthroscopy of shoulder (eg, 29805)
- 13. manipulation under anesthesia (eg, 23700)
