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Bioskills Session Space • Application/Contract Policies

1. Eligibility

Bioskills session space is only available to companies exhibiting at AAOS 2020.

2. Assignment of Bioskills Session Space

- a. Bioskills session space will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. AAOS reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to allocate Bioskills session space on any other basis it deems appropriate. Lab space will be confirmed with a specific date, time and assigned didactic presentation area and Bioskills lab number.
- b. Once space is assigned the exhibitor is responsible for finalizing all arrangements directly with STI. Any penalty incurred between the exhibitor and STI is the responsibility of the exhibitor. It is understood that AAOS accepts no responsibility for the event(s).
- c. Exhibitors that reserve Bioskills session space will:
 - be responsible for inviting attendees.
 - be responsible for securing attendees.
 - work directly with STI for procuring any additional equipment or cadaver specimens.
 - work directly with Centerplate, the official caterer at the Orange County Convention Center, to order food and beverages for didactic presentation area.

3. Payment Terms

Once space is assigned an invoice for 100% of sessions fees will be sent. Payment is due within 30 days of invoice or space will be released. Payments can be made to AAOS by check, wire transfer or credit card.

4. Cancellation Policy

All cancellations for confirmed and assigned Bioskills sessions must be sent in writing to AAOS. Written notice of cancellation must be received by the dates listed below to receive a refund:

- Through November 25, 2019: 50% of session space fees are retained
- After November 25, 2019: 100% of session space fees are retained

5. Regulations

- a. AAOS does not endorse exhibitor functions and does not consider them a part of the official program.
- b. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that all company personnel or third party agents that are involved in Bioskills session arrangements are aware of and adhere to AAOS rules and regulations.
- c. Badges and Bar Codes
Bioskills sessions will take place in Academy Hall C at the Orange County Convention Center, West Building, therefore, all exhibitors and attendees will be required to

wear their AAOS official badges for admission to this area of the convention center. Exhibitors will be allowed to scan and capture AAOS badge bar code data at their Bioskills sessions.

6. CME Accreditation

AAOS does not provide Continuing Medical Education (CME) accreditation for exhibitor educational events. Exhibitors are not allowed to offer CME credits for Bioskills sessions.

7. Publicity and Advertising

- a. All promotional materials (including announcements, invitations, emails, websites, advertisements, and flyers) referencing the Bioskills session at the AAOS Annual Meeting must be approved by AAOS prior to printing and/ or distribution. Final versions of materials should be submitted for approval to exhibits@aaos.org. While AAOS will make every effort to grant these approvals in a timely fashion, please allow a minimum of five (5) business days for approval.
- b. The use of the name, insignia, logo, logotype or other identifying marks of the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons/American Association of Orthopaedic Surgeons other than the approved exhibitor graphic, is never to be used in signs, advertising or promotions in any media or on descriptive product literature. Refer to the Publicity and Advertising section of the Rules and Regulations at www.aaos.org/exhibitors for more information.

8. Signage

AAOS will provide a 22" x 28" exhibitor identification sign at the exhibitor's assigned didactic presentation area. Bioskills labs will be identified with a Lab number. Exhibitors may display signage in the exhibitor's booth and the Bioskills didactic presentation area.

9. Indemnification

Exhibitors assigned Bioskills session space at AAOS 2020 agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the AAOS, STI, its employees, directors, agents, representatives and any affiliated organizations against any and all claims, judgments, fees, demands, settlements and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) that arise as a result of the company's performance, or non-performance, of duties in this Agreement.
